LETTER FROM JOHN HOWELL MP

So many different issues affect our health and well-being, as individuals and collectively, and we are acutely aware of this in our current circumstances. One of the key issues is our environment. I have been very grateful this year to live in the rural setting that this constituency offers and have been particularly mindful of those who live in over-crowded urban situations. Being able to get out and walk in the countryside has been important to me in keeping fit and well. As I have walked over the months I have enjoyed watching the changes in the landscape and been perhaps more conscious than in other years of the cycle of work for our farmers.

It is good news that the Agriculture Bill which has been progressing through Parliament this year has now passed into law. During the passage of the Bill some important changes were made particularly to tighten up on issues around the recognition of our farmers in food production and also on food security. I believe that the Act is a good robust piece of legislation that sets the way forward, ensuring that our farmers are not undercut, and that the high quality of our food is maintained. It also sets out how farmers and land managers will be rewarded for the work they do towards protecting and encouraging wildlife, better air and water quality, and measures to reduce flooding. All of this contributes towards achieving the goals of the 25 Year Environment Plan.

I now look forward to the Environment Bill coming back to the House in December. The Agriculture Act has a specific focus on farming and land management. The Environment Bill will put the environment at the heart of all policy making ensuring that this and future Governments are held to account on their wider environmental duties. Just as the Agriculture Act set the Trade and Agriculture Commission in statute so the Environment Bill will establish the Office for Environmental protection. The Government's 25 Year Environment Plan will also be placed on a statutory footing, and a set of environmental principles will be introduced that will be used to guide future government policy making. I know that developing a Nature Recovery Network is important to many. A framework for Local Nature Recovery Strategies will be legislated in the Environment Bill. More information can be found on the Parliament website.

I am aware that this newsletter will appear in December publications. I hope that by then we will be out of lockdown and all able to look forward to a festive break that is something like the normal break we would take at the end of the year. It has been a difficult year in many ways, but I am optimistic that the tide will soon turn thanks to the wonderful work of our scientists who have thrown so much effort at vaccine research. However I know that for many families COVID has taken the most dreadful toll and that loved ones are sorely missed all of the time and will be especially so during festivities. No words can ease that and I offer my deepest sympathies to all of you who face such loss.

ASTON ROWANT PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Welcome to the last update of what has been a year constrained by the Covid19 pandemic. The restrictions imposed as part of the measures to contain the outbreak has meant that many events and activities have been cancelled. Some, however, have been able to continue, albeit in a much changed form. One such event was the Remembrance Service at Aston Rowant Church. A short service was held around the war memorial at the front of the Church which allowed around thirty parishioners to remember those who gave their lives in serving their country. The Remembrance Service is usually very well attended; I would like to thank Rev Brian Griffiths and the various church members whose work enabled the service to proceed.





During the course of the summer over £4000 was spent by the Parish Council and Hillwerke Recreational Trust on repairs on the play area in Kingston Blount. However, shortly after the work was completed a new problem was identified on the activity centre which required it to be fenced off. Since then, the bridge between the two parts of the activity centre has also broken and has also been fenced off. We would be grateful if parents could ensure that their children do not use the parts of the equipment that have been fenced off.

On the positive side, the speed restricting chicane on the B4009 on the west side of Kingston Blount was completed and has been operational for over a month. Initial indications are that is has slowed traffic travelling through the village and has made turning onto the B4009 from both Kingston Hill and the Stert Road easier. We continue to look at measures in Aston Rowant.

I am always impressed with the level of volunteering within the Parish. Eight parishioners picked litter over the course of the weekend on Kingston Hill and along

the A40 and B4009 in Aston Rowant. In all they picked 24 bags of assorted rubbish. My thanks to all those who gave up part of their weekend to help tidy up the Parish.

At the time of writing we are in the second lockdown of the year. There will be some members of the Parish who will be self-isolating and will require assistance. The Parish Council has developed a network of volunteers who are willing to help those who need assistance; the contact details of those volunteers are included on the back cover.

2020 has been a difficult year for many. We are fortunate, however, to live in such a beautiful part of the country and in a Parish where there is a strong sense of community where people are always willing to help others.

I wish you all the best for Christmas and the New Year.

KINGSTON BLOUNT PLAY AREA

Anyone who either uses the playground in the playing field or simply walks past it will appreciate that the playground equipment is showing its age.

It is now 22 years old and despite the Parish Council and the Hillwerke Trust having spent over £4,000 on repairs this year, since the summer the bridge on the activity centre has become unusable and is now roped off to prevent any accidents.

Rather than just spending more money on the centre which will prove to be a case of throwing good money after bad, we are proposing that we should form a small group of people to start the ball rolling to replace the parts which need replacing. This will not just be the playground equipment, but also the fence and the outside components. Parish councillors will be part of the group, but we want to engage with as many people as possible.

We are aware that grants may well be available to help fund the replacements but in order to qualify for these we will need plans and proper costing. Rather than this just being done by the councillors we would like the proposed group to help specify the requirements and then assist with the fund raising. This is what occurred when the playground was originally built, and we would like to replicate the success of the initial project.

ARPC FOOTPATH AND AMENITIES GROUP

Don't know about you but I have enjoyed the beautiful Autumn colours this year. Winter is just round the corner so I don't know if the plentiful supply of berries means it's going to be a hard winter but they will certainly be great for the birds and good for bringing brightness into our homes this Christmas.

The Footpath and Amenities Group have been very busy working on and arranging maintenance around the Parish Paths with the help of Land Owners. This includes Church Lane, the Moors Footpath and Aston Green, the Kingston Blount Lanes and the new Permissive path to Crowell which continues to stand up well to some very heavy usage. It is so important we give priority to this work because this year has seen many more parishioners walking these routes for daily exercise. Also, at present, OCC don't have a maintenance team to be able to assist with this type of work.

We have increased our maintenance work at Fiveways, an area for nature in Aston Rowant. Also more wild flowers have been planted. Please see Mike Eaton's separate report on page 18.

Other tasks have included organising crown raising (ie taking off the lower branches) of the cherry trees in Aston Rowant, new tree planting and improving the appearance of the entrances to the villages, and litter picking.

All this work has been supported by funding by ARPC and the physical help of your Councillors and Parishioners.

Which brings me to the continuing invaluable help of Simon Coulon who alone plants, waters and tends to the Village Flower Tubs year in year out. They have just been replanted and they look great. A big thank you to Si.

Two of us recognised that the entrances to the villages were getting to look a bit untidy. So we had the Aston Rowant white entrance gates cleaned and repainted, cut the hedges, cleaned the signs and swept up the loose gravel in both villages. Thanks to Peter Gibbons for his help in this. The work was funded by ARPC and is now going on the list of annual maintenance tasks for the Council for future years.

Litter and fly tipping is a huge problem in the Parish. We organised a Litter Pick just before the latest lockdown. 23 large bags of litter were collected but this really was only a catch up. Tony Hughes and Cate go out regularly litter picking – the work, independently supported by Richard Allan. Thanks to them all.

I have some excellent news for you. Councillor Steven Sowerby has agreed to Chair the Footpath and Amenities Group from 1 January '21 and I will continue as a committee member. I also will continue as Aston Rowant Parish Path Warden. The latter is as a volunteer for OCC Countryside Services, not ARPC, and involves reporting rights of way problems to them.

NEWS FROM FIVEWAYS

By the time you read this it will be the end of 2020, a year which will be remembered for a long time. We saw a large increase in visitor numbers during the first lockdown and more people seem to be out walking again now and often stop and say how good it looks. My young grandson is still keen on finding artefacts there and after the success of finding the old bottles we bought him a metal detector and magnet for magnet fishing for his birthday. So far he has pulled out lots of nails from the stream and some old cooking pots from the path, all signs of the habitation which used to be there.

Many of you have watched the results from my camera traps and these are now available online at www.astonrowantparishcouncil.gov.uk/fiveways-corner. The stoats and owl are good but I think the crayfish is the best. We enjoy seeing the results of the wildlife camera and I would recommend getting one as a Christmas gift for anyone

interested in nature. I also enjoy taking photos - some of which are shown here. The peacock caterpillars were on the nettles in the Summer at 5-ways and I was in the right place for once. The Yellow, Pink and Purple Toadflax (see opposite) are all local wild plants or garden weeds. My lovely neighbour now leaves weeds on my doorstep for me to plant. Our gardens are a good source of wild flowers which



otherwise would be pulled up and composted. There are a few desirable wild flowers in the parish and sensible collection of seed is legal. The timing of seed collection is critical and I could do with some people to help with this but it isn't as easy as you'd think.

As I write in November I am planting out seedlings such as Mallow, Valerian and Vetch. I have also distributed very showy Yellow Monkey Musk plants around the villages so look out for these next year near the water courses.

The Footpath and Amenities Group have organised for the ditches in Church Lane to be dug out to try to stop flooding and improve drainage. I always look for the wild garlic going down on the left in March where the land drain pipe emerges. You can smell it when it emerges. There is a lot more alongside the stream at Fiveways, they have white flowers.

Some of you will have noticed that the sloes this year were enormous and only the high ones were left when we came to pick them so others obviously are partial to Sloe gin! There are still some left and they can be frozen until needed. I take part in a Sloe gin competition every year in Scotland when salmon fishing, but my record is not good. The lockdown led to enormous interest in my rhubarb this year and armfuls were converted to strong alcoholic drinks.

On a festive note watch out along Church lane at Fiveways for my holly bushes which are in berry. There are a good dozen of them, they have been challenging due to the summer droughts which killed a lot off. In time they should provide evergreen shelter for birds and berries.

Sadly there will be no duck racing in 2021 due to Covid, but I am sure the snowdrops and daffodils will still be there for everyone to enjoy. Thank you to the few people who have volunteered to help, I will be looking for more help in the Spring so please think about it. I still have a few mulberry trees to spare if anyone would like one for their garden.





TESSA WYATT'S COUNTRYSIDE DIARY

October 1 After over a year without a horse, I have finally found a new one to be my countryside companion. A little grey dun Connemara pony called Katie. Winter isn't normally the best time to take on a new equine, the weather being so dodgy as to make riding regularly sometimes difficult, but sometimes one has no choice but to follow one's heart.

October 2 Katie and I, in the company of friends, venture out on our first hack as an 'item'. We meander through the woods around Nettlebed, while I try to learn the route. The horses' soft hoof beats thump along tracks laid down centuries before as byways between the villages and now covered by hundreds of years of leaf mould, except on the steeper paths where the heavy rains have washed it away to reveal the flint beneath.

October 8 Another ride in the woods. Silence, apart from the creak of leather, soft snorts and the occasional birdsong to keep us company. Bluett mushrooms sprout from the ground, yellow legs decorate fallen logs and I see a magnificent Beefsteak fungus growing out of the trunk of a tree and long to stop and cut it as they are delicious to eat, but I didn't bring a bag to put it in so sadly have to leave it. Somebody got in early and has taken all the ceps. Grrr.

October 15 I take a walk around the village and down to Fiveways. It's getting very muddy and the skeletons of the trees are beginning to show. A huge chattering parliament of rooks flies overhead, heading towards the Colonel's Cover a few fields away. I envy their point of view from above, the countryside that I can only see little pieces of laid out for them like the view seen from a camera drone.

November 1 How I love autumn. I watch the ground beneath the beech trees turn copper as the trees themselves turn back to the colour of the earth from which they sprung. A muntjac crosses the track in front of me, and a covey of partridge run ahead like excited children, looking for a gap in the hedge to dive into. The scent coming up from the ground under Katie's hooves is very pungent, smelling of wet earth and rotting plants.

November 10 Two owls are having a hootenanny on The Green, one in the chestnut at the far end near Chiltern Cottage, the other my end in the great lime. They are youngsters, busy establishing their new territories. I hope they sort it out soon, they're keeping me awake!

November 14 Rain! My cat Tinker refuses to go out, and then finally takes the plunge, coming in dripping. John dries her off with kitchen roll. She gives him a little mew of thanks. Katie is in her field in a cosy rug, sheltering under the trees, and I'm indoors in the warm writing this. The ladybirds are trying to get in through the windows to hibernate in the house or at least squeeze themselves into the gaps in the window frames. Some years we have had groups of hundreds snuggled together behind the curtains in the spare room. This year there are only a few so far. Just as well, as they have awful BO!!
