LETTER FROM JOHN HOWELL MP

When I wrote in December, for publication in January, I was optimistic for this new year and now in January, despite this current lockdown, I do remain so. Having said that I fully appreciate the difficulties of yet another tightening of restrictions. I know that some people are very worried and others very frustrated, but it is essential. However I do remain optimistic as we see more vaccines approved and the pace of the rollout stepped up. The priorities for vaccination remain to protect the vulnerable, reduce deaths and reduce pressure on the NHS. In conversation with the Chief Executive of the Oxfordshire Clinical Commissioning Group, which is heavily involved in the rollout, I have been reassured that we are on track to meet the Government schedule. At the start of the rollout it took time to get different locations set up and more will be operational by the time this newsletter is published. There is plenty of supply of the vaccine and it is being used as it becomes available. The Government is, of course, concerned to make sure that distribution is evenly spread across the county so that vulnerable people nationwide are protected. I am sure that most of us will be relieved when we personally have the protection of the vaccine, but we have to be patient and we have to look at the collective good. Our turn will come and in the meantime we must all continue to follow measures to protect one another whether we have been vaccinated or not.

In this current lockdown Parliament continues to run as best it can with remote working. The Speaker has strongly encouraged MPs not to travel into London unless absolutely necessary and has limited further the number of MPs who can be in the Chamber at any one time. However, this does not mean we are simply twiddling our thumbs; far from it. Many changes have been made to enable MPs to carry on with important business. My staff team continue to work remotely and together we are doing our best to respond to the heavy workload we are experiencing particularly at present.

Council of Europe

I am delighted and honoured to have been asked by the Prime Minister to become Leader of the UK delegation to the Council of Europe. The Council of Europe is a non-EU organisation of which we remain as members beyond Brexit. My delegation is cross-party and represents the UK at the Council in a number of ways including dealing with climate change and other important issues. The Council of Europe was founded in 1949, in the wake of the Second world War to uphold human rights, democracy and the rule of law in Europe. It has 47 member states and remains an important link with our European neighbours. The Parliamentary Assembly is made up of parliamentary representatives from the members states and has to reflect the political balance of the country.

And although I have every confidence in the Covid-secure measures we have in place, I feel there is a moral duty to limit opportunities for social gatherings at this time, especially when the daily number of coronavirus cases continues to climb.

I'm painfully aware that, for many of you, coming to church is a source of comfort and joy, and maybe even providing a sense of normality, and I'm so sorry that there will be no in-person services during January. NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN

Now that adoption of the draft Local Plan appears to be reaching a conclusion, the Neighbourhood Plan committee have begun to review the comments received in response to the public consultation that ran from February – June last year. An initial review suggests that the majority of respondents endorse the approach taken in the draft plan i.e. not to allocate specific sites for development but to rely on infill for future growth. The committee recognise that this strategy carries some risk should SODC's land supply fall below the requisite number. The committee will be carrying out a more detailed review over the coming months, to incorporate comments from public bodies such as SODC and to consider whether points from the more detailed responses merit inclusion or alteration of the draft. The aim is to complete this work over the next two months with a view to publishing a revised draft and Consultation Report in time for a public (probably virtual) meeting in mid February.

GARDEN WASTE COLLECTION (AS OF 19 JANUARY 2021)

As you may already be aware, we had to delay the restart of the garden waste collection service after the usual Christmas break. The extended pause is as a result of some staff sickness due to Covid-19 and others having to self-isolate.

We have reviewed the staffing levels and unfortunately we are currently unable to predict accurately when it will resume.

We will review the situation on a week by week basis, and we will let you know as soon as we are in a position to restart the service. We will keep you updated via our garden waste pages and on our social media sites.

We want to reassure you that along with our contractors Biffa we have explored all the options possible to avoid this situation as we realise that this may cause inconvenience and

we are genuinely sorry for this. However, the safety of our crews and residents must always be our number one priority. This will allow the remaining staff to work on the core household waste services (food, recycling and rubbish).

If you would like to dispose of your Christmas tree you can take it to one of Oxfordshire County Council's Household Waste Recycling Centres. These sites are open but please check their website for opening times and any restrictions, particularly Covid-19 restrictions. Or if you'd rather, you can wait until the garden waste service resumes and we'll take it then.

Again we apologise for any inconvenience and will let you know as soon as we're able to reinstate the service for existing customers.

ASTON ROWANT PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

The December and January meetings are when the Council reviews the current year's expenditure and sets the budget for the following year. I am pleased to say that we are projected to be under budget for the majority of budget headings which means that we will be able to maintain the precept at the same level as this year. We are not anticipating any increased spend on our general maintenance, grass cutting, footpaths and amenities, and administration in 2021/22. There is an increase in the cost of dog-bin emptying as the SODC subsidy for this ceased mid-2020 and although a new contractor will be cheaper, they will charge more than we used to pay. This is offset by reduced costs for our website.

The chicane on the B4009 in Kingston Blount was the major expenditure in the year. The Council made a substantial contribution to the cost of this work by drawing on our reserves. This year we will be building up the reserves to allow us to focus on similar measures in Aston Rowant. I am pleased to say that our funds for traffic calming will be bolstered by a contribution from the Community Infrastructure Levy, a fund that is built up by contributions from new buildings.

In addition to building up our general reserves and those earmarked for traffic calming, the Council is also building reserves to maintain the play area in Kingston Blount. The play area has needed a significant amount of maintenance this year and we were fortunate that the Hillwerke Recreational Trust were able to contribute to the cost of those repairs. We recognise that a lot of the equipment in the play area is reaching end of life and may need further work during the course of the year to ensure that the play area remains usable.

At the time of writing we are in the third lockdown of the Covid-19 pandemic. The Government has been encouraging all to shop locally and we are indeed fortunate to have the Lockdown Larder on Kingston Blount farm. Many parishioners have told me how pleased they are that the Larder has been established and that is now part of their regular shopping routine. Our thanks to Karen Clark for her initiative in setting up the Larder during the first lockdown and her initiative in growing the range of products on offer.

Finally, the vaccination programme is well underway in our area with many of the most vulnerable having received their first doses. Although the vaccinations offer hope that there is light at the end of the tunnel, there are still some that require support and assistance because they are self isolating or shielding. A quick reminder to close this update that the Parish Council established a network of volunteers to assist others during this current crisis. Their contact details are elsewhere in this edition of the Parish Notes.



Happy New Year to everyone. It is not the start of the year that anyone wanted but we must make the best of it. Keep safe.

This is the first report I've written since taking over from Peter Hetherington, and I'm very conscious that I have big shoes to fill. I must start by thanking Peter not just for the work he has done over many years but also for the help and guidance he has given and continues to do so.

The cancellation of both the Parish Walk and Snowdrop Sunday is not a good start, especially the Snowdrop Sunday which makes me smile every time I think about the children (of all ages) splashing about in the brook. Hopefully they will be back next year.

It is good to see so many people using the footpaths and I would encourage as many people as possible to get out and walk the beautiful countryside we are so lucky to live in. If you haven't walked the footpaths, please make sure you are wearing the correct clothes and footwear. If you do so you will perhaps understand why so many people enjoy a simple walk.

Mike Eaton has written his usual report on FiveWays (see page 18), and if you haven't been down there, I would recommend it to everyone.

Whilst most projects are on hold, we have purchased 6 more trees to plant out in the parish, 2 Rowans on B4009 in Aston Rowant on headland near our cherry trees, 2 Rowans in Five Ways, 2 Oaks on headland on path from KB Playing field towards Lower Icknield Way. Thanks to Alan and Lawney Hill for their permission.

We will also see the removal of a large tree in the 'lane' between Pleck Lane and the Old Shoulder of Mutton and at the same time remove the brambles that are overgrowing the path.

Hopefully the next report will see some positive news.

NEWS FROM FIVEWAYS

Fiveways has started to be busier again with Lockdown. It is safe with plenty of distancing and often a breeze. There are still things to see even in mid-Winter. The red campion flowered throughout December and now the snowdrops are starting to show some white. There is the odd primrose in flower too. The hollies are doing remarkably well now and should provide some evergreen wind protection in some years time.

You may have noticed that the stream has been cleared out down to the bottom. This was mainly done by Scarlett, who is doing a Duke of Edinburgh award assisted by her family. A local contractor has also dug out part of Church lane... and the lower stream for the first time. Sadly there is no duck racing this year, what a shame as the course is in such good order. Can I ask the young water engineers to reduce/move their damming activities and not to move the bridges used by wildlife. Please don't put logs etc in the stream as they can go downstream, block culverts and cause problems. There is also some beer drinking going on which I don't mind, but please take your bottles home!

I have planted out well over a 100 wild flower plants. They are Valerian, Viper's Bugloss, Mallow, Geraniums, Verbascum, and Fox and Cubs. They come mainly from seed I have collected and grown but my neighbour's weeds are represented as well. I am going to try Fritillaria Meleagris again. One of the largest concentrations of them in the UK is in the water meadows around Oxford. I have planted them as bulbs in the past with only one survivor which comes up every year. The bulbs are not poisonous and rodents I think have eaten them previously, as soon as I planted them. This year they have done brilliantly and are emerging in my green house and awaiting my decision when to plant them. They are supposed to be easy.... but then why have I failed for 3 years? They do like to be dry in the Summer which is not hard these days.

The extra flow that Scarlett has created has scoured the stream bed exposing the wooden water cress beds, which I think date from the second world war. They are just downstream of the wildlife bridge with the sand bags. There are elm boards visible across the stream bed. The water plants will re-establish in the stream in a few months and wild watercress hopefully will come back. Of special note is the Monkey Musk - there are two plants at the water exit from Fiveways. There are more to be found of these showy yellow plants around local streams .


My wild life camera has been out, but no sign of the local otters which I know to be there. It would be good if someone could get a picture. Aston lake I think is the best hope. There are some on the other side of the motorway too in Lewknor lake where they are not welcome. The trout there are a rare local species and especially vulnerable to predation.

The Footpath and Amenities group as usual is planting more trees - Oaks and Rowan this year , two Rowans will go in at Fiveways . One will replace the rotten tree in the ex-bramble patch which will be removed when it is safe to do so.

The staff and pupils were all back on Monday 4th January and then from Tuesday 5th January we opened for Key worker children, and vulnerable children. We have over 40% of our children attending school in two different bubbles, and for those not able to attend in person online learning has begun.

Whilst it has been a challenge to re-plan and re-think what we are going to teach this term, and how we are going to teach it, the principles of what we want to achieve this new year with the children in our care remain the same. We want to instil hope in our children even when they face uncertainty. To make learning both fun and interesting. To challenge and inspire each child to take a risk with their learning. To be kind and encouraging to those learning if they fail and to joyfully celebrate when they succeed.






We are going to improve the surface in the car park, the scalpings have already been delivered and also hope to plant some walnut trees on the ground.
