### LETTER FROM JOHN HOWELL MP

Last month I said that during the parliamentary recess I would be meeting with representatives from a number of parish councils across the constituency. This proved to be a helpful use of time and whilst there were several individual local concerns there were also some key themes emerging around transport, policing, health services and planning.

The lack of buses was raised in several parishes. I know that this has been a concern for some time, and I have met with bus companies to discuss possible strategies. The Government has recognised the importance of the bus network and has published a National Bus Strategy which is an ambitious shake-up of the bus sector which is backed with a £3 billion fund to which local councils can bid to support local investment. I am pleased that the county council is now taking advantage of this Government Strategy and has established an Enhanced Partnership with local bus companies.

With policing there were several issues around visibility of a police officer and in several parishes it was felt that higher profile could be a helpful deterrent where there are local concerns over such issues as drugs trading. There are also several parishes in the middle of the constituency affected by leisure motorbikes with issues of speed and noise. I have met with the Police and Crime Commissioner to raise these concerns and he has committed to meet with those parishes concerned with the motorbike issues and to look into the other policing issues on our behalf.

There have been a number of concerns raised with me over local health services, particularly access to GPs which have also been picked up in the media. In response to these concerns I have recently met with some of our local doctors to understand the issues from their perspective and have a greater appreciation of concerns on both sides. I am seeking meetings with senior teams in NHS Oxfordshire to discuss what can be done.

Last but by no means least there are concerns about planning and development. I am certainly very aware of these and there is no one answer which would address many individual issues. The planning system is complex and different issues need to be tackled in different ways. I have already raised some issues with Ministers directly and in debate in the House and, along with many others, am waiting with interest to see what the long-awaited planning reforms bring forward.

We would like to offer you an amnesty for putting lights on the graves of your loved ones throughout November and December. We would really appreciate it if the lights could be removed by the twelfth day of Christmas (6th January).

We would also encourage you to use decorations made from natural materials such as wreaths, wood and real plants and small trees (under 2ft). We are committed to reducing the use of plastic in our churchyards so if you can avoid plastic items we'd be very grateful.

### **ASTON ROWANT PARISH COUNCIL NEWS**

There have been a number of developments regarding traffic calming and speed monitoring measures in the past two months. I am pleased to report that the Highway Management Committee of Oxfordshire County Council met in October and recommended that both the proposed chicane on the B4009 in Aston Rowant and the introduction of a 20mph speed limit in Aston Rowant village be approved. The Parish Council will continue to work with the County Council to implement these measures. Our thanks to Councillors John Wyatt and Matt Day for their work on these measures.

Oxfordshire County Council has launched its much-anticipated new 20mph policy. The policy changes the Council's approach and acceptance of 20mph restrictions will enable a much greater coverage across Oxfordshire. We are now investigating how we can introduce further 20mph restrictions in the Parish following the recommendation for a 20mph limit in Aston Rowant village.

A number of parishioners have joined the Parish Community Speedwatch scheme. As noted in the last edition of the Notes, we are looking for volunteers to help monitor speed throughout the Parish. Volunteers need to register on the Community Speedwatch website (https://www.communityspeedwatch.org/), complete training on the code of conduct and health and safety measures and join the Kingston Blount Aston Rowant group.

I am pleased to report that Openreach has confirmed that the scheme to bring FTTP (Fibre to the premise) to the parish has been approved by the Department for Culture, Media and Sport. Residents now need to confirm their interest by pledging

their commitment to Openreach. We are grateful to Councillor Adam Bernstein for his work in coordinating this work. Adam has given details of the next steps on Page 17.

Unfortunately there have been a number of incidents recently where dogs have bitten people, attacked other dogs or caused alarm amongst the public. The picture shows the aftermath of 90 minutes of procedures with the plastics team after an incident where a dog owner intervened when his dog was being attacked by another. Clearly the vast majority of dogs are well behaved but even a friendly dog running up to a nervous person can cause alarm. Whilst the parish council has no jurisdiction (it is a matter for the Police), we would ask that dog owners remember their obligation to keep their dogs under control at all times when in a public space. The Dangerous Dogs Act 1991 covers not just situations where a dog has bitten someone, but also where it causes someone to have a 'reasonable' fear they could



be injured. No-one wants to see a situation where action is taken against a dog owner in our Parish.

A number of parishioners responded to my plea for volunteers to help organise celebrations for the Queen's Platinum Jubilee. As is often the case, the team are looking for more volunteers; if you are able to help, please contact Kathi Davis at platinumjubilee2021@gmail.com.

Last Christmas the country was in lockdown with visits to and from friends and family severely restricted. Hopefully this year we will be able to meet and gather in larger numbers to celebrate over the festive season. I wish you all the best for Christmas and the New Year.

### **OPENREACH**

The scheme to bring FTTP to the parish has been approved by DCMS and "declared active" by Openreach. It can now start to process applications for each resident.

Residents need to visit www.openreach.co.uk/connectmycommunity. Ignore the name 'Aston Park'; that will be corrected. The link will ask for your details for the pledge. This will be passed to DCMS which will email directly to verify the voucher. Openreach will submit the pledges in batches so don't be surprised if there's a delay between your pledge going onto Openreach and DCMS making contact.

We have until 13 February 2022 to get all the pledges in. If we don't get enough then the scheme will not go ahead.

The link above will only permit addresses from our community to access and register. Also, be aware that once you pledge, and the install goes ahead, you have two months to sign up for FTTP with the ISP of your choice. **If you do not, then Openreach may reclaim costs from you**. Remember, you can choose any provider you wish – BT, Sky, Talk Talk and so on. Once Openreach has all the vouchers validated, and returned, and the gap cost is covered by funding, it should then be able to proceed forward to delivery.

As for cost of a fibre service, Openreach doesn't set the pricing – that's down to your chosen ISP and the package you select. However, you can expect to pay in the range of £30-60 per month. That said, you can make a huge saving by cancelling your landline \*\*unless\*\* your package contractually requires you to have one. Naturally, it's up to each resident to check their contract before cancelling.

In an age of mobile telephony many rarely use a landline to make calls. But for those that want to keep their landline number, it's perfectly possible that an ISP will let them port their landline number to a VOIP service (Voice over Internet Protocol – think internet phone... see https://techterms.com/definition/voip) for a minimal charge.

Remember, fibre isn't wholly about speed (although that's a key reason), it's also about stability and reliability. Don't misunderstand me, fibre isn't perfect, but it's a whole lot more reliable that a copper wire.

Lastly, can I ask that you all **let me know when you've made your pledge** via the email address below. I'd like to keep close tabs on the process.

# CITIZENS ADVICE INFORMATION ON VANISHING ENERGY SUPPLIERS

Many people have had the disconcerting experience of seeing their energy supplier break up and go out of business during the recent energy price fluctuations. It sounds pretty drastic, but the situation isn't as bad as it seems.

If you are one of those affected, remember these key facts: first of all, the gas or electricity supply itself won't be interrupted, so don't be concerned about that. Next, you should know that Ofgem, the industry regulator, will automatically move you to a new supplier. This usually takes a few weeks.

Wait for your new supplier to contact you. They will explain what will happen with your new account. But contact the new supplier yourself if you haven't heard from them within two weeks. You can check on www.citizensadvice.org.uk ("check who's taken over your energy supply") if you're not sure who your new supplier is.

While you're waiting to hear from the new supplier, it's a good idea to take meter readings (and a photo of the readings) as they might prove useful later. Make a note of your account balance too. Keep any old bills you have, as these can help prove your payment history, credit balance or debt.

If you aren't happy with your new supplier or tariff, you can switch suppliers. Look at "switch energy supplier" on our website or ring the Citizens Advice Consumer Helpline on 0808 223 1133.

### ARPC FOOTPATH AND AMENITIES GROUP

The autumn season is now fully with us, the sight of the wonderful colour in the turning leaves is amazing, and walkers can kick through leaves all pretending we are children again. It is a wonderful time of year.

But the leaves do cause problems, so can I respectfully ask all landowners to ensure their grips are clear and that all householders keep the ditches open so we don't have the flooding issues of last winter. This is especially relevant in Aston Rowant - can I thank you in advance for your work.

Walkers going down Church Lane will see that the first phase of the upgrade has been completed, as the scalpings have been put down. George Stevens will fill in the potholes that are left before the winter. Can I thank both the parish council for funding the work and George for his help and advice.

Mike Eaton will comment on the work done on the stream at Fiveways in his report. We have been in contact with both SODC and OCC with reference to the project to improve the lanes in Kingston Blount. I have also spoken to the majority of the householders whose properties back onto the lanes and there is a consensus emerging of what we want to do, but as it is within the conservation area we must consult and get agreement from SODC.

Whilst researching the lanes I have come across a reference from 1988 which refers to the lane running between the High Street and Brook Street as 'Messums Lane'. In my 20 years in the village I have not heard of this name - if anyone can pass on any information on this name, I would be very grateful

Can I once again repeat the request from previous notes - if you have an idea or a project you would like us to consider please contact me? As a group we will meet in February to discuss next year's objectives. If you would like to join the group, again please get in touch.

# THE 'CHRISTMAS BOOK FLOOD'


One tradition that could help with some much needed space creation is the Icelandic notion of Jólabókaflód or the Christmas Book Flood.

### **NEWS FROM FIVEWAYS**

With a small band of helpers we have cleared the stream and cut back the growth on the banks in preparation for the duck racing, hopefully on 20th February 2022. The growth was excessive this year. There remains more to do as the ducks try to hide when released into the vegetation that has grown into the stream. They are rescued by my band of young helpers on the day with various tools.

Keen observers will note that the track has been partly resurfaced and "regripped" to run the water off. Thanks go to the Parish Council for funding it. Please do not put garden waste in the ditches for the PC to clear for you! The stream exit from Fiveways has been dug out to try to stop flooding.... we will see if it works. This reminds me that the stream downstream of the central bridge is advanced wading only! It is easy to get stuck in there because of the build up of fine silt. If you go in you will likely need help to get out, especially if you stop. I speak from experience. Others have taken it as a challenge.

There were winners and losers amongst the plants this year. The Burdocks did very well as did the wood anemones and daffodils but the bluebells made no progress. The yellow toadflax expanded its range significantly but flowered very little by comparison to last year. Another success is the holly which is starting to line the track as intended, but sadly essentially berry free for Christmas. The Holm oak which is a neophyte i.e. an introduced species (ca 1600) is making substantial growth near the signpost. The Footpath group has learnt that it is better to plant small and wait - large plants and trees look good but die when not watered in the Summer.

The sycamore trees at Fiveways are problematic as many are diseased, as is common across the country. I am not certain however what the particular problem is and would appreciate advice if anyone knows.

Fiveways is probably the most popular dog walking route in the parish and I thank owners for keeping it mainly poo free. Please feel free to feed the water shrews with fallen apples - they appreciate them and they are eaten in a few days (see picture opposite). They mainly live on the far bank.



It has come to my attention that some of our local youth have discovered the pleasures of crayfish fishing in our streams. I will not mention the best places as it will lead to overcrowding. Please be mindful of hazards. There are no crayfish in Aston lake - it could be the fish are eating them. They are very vulnerable when moulting and are a favourite of carp.

I would be interested to hear of any fish seen in the local streams. The trout migrate

upstream to spawn in the coming months when the water is high. They are seen in Lewknor but absent here in recent years.



### CLARE'S LONDON MARATHON



My marathon journey started all the way back in April 2019 when I entered the 2020 London Marathon after feeling inspired by watching it on TV and knowing I would be 40 for the 40th Marathon in London. I had been through a terrible time that year mentally and suffered quite badly with anxiety brought on by various incidents. Running was my escape from my thoughts and helped me so much.

Then in the October I received the newsletter saying 'You're In'!! I thought it was a joke, but it definitely wasn't and I got through first time into the ballot!! As it wasn't a charity placement and I wanted to give something back to a charity that had helped me, I decided to raise money for MIND.

My training was soon underway but then Covid 19 shook everyone's world and we were told the race couldn't happen in April 2020 but would become a virtual event in October 2020. I did it around the surrounding villages on the worst day in October where paths were flooded and the wind cut through you. With the support of friends and family I completed 26.2 miles in 5:15. Keeping a base line fitness level and fast forwarding to 2021, we were told the Marathon would go ahead in October, in London, under strict rules.

My training started again, running through summer days and nights, trying not to get heat stroke (like the previous year) and with so many villagers shouting out kind encouraging words, I was more determined than ever to beat my previous year's time.

Finally when race day came, my husband and I made our way up to London. Even writing this, I am getting emotional!

He dropped me off at the start and made his way to his (first of many) viewing areas around London.

Due to covid restrictions, everyone had to go off in waves; set times based on your predicted finish time. As mine was the 5hr mark, I ended up being with all of the runners that dress up. The race started and the crowds were out of this world. So many people, so many signs, so much noise and support, it was incredible. I literally did not take the smile off of my face the whole way around! Actually that's a lie... at mile 18-19 when I hit a low point and my body was asking me what the hell I was doing and I saw my husband and broke down in tears.

A few people happened to be in London and came along and cheered as they were tracking me on the app. When you hear your name it sends tingles through you and gives you that extra push you need, especially at mile 21 when the heavens opened for 20mins.

I finished the run in 4:56 and was ever so chuffed. After the past two years it was a long time coming and I am left with a memory that I will never forget, a jaw ache from smiling so much, a very large medal taking pride of place with my previous years one and an experience of a lifetime. Do it, enter the marathon, you'll thank me after!

I raised over £,1000 for MIND after doing two marathons in two years.
