## LETTER FROM JOHN HOWELL MP

I agree with the Prime Minster when he said that New Year should be a time of optimism and excitement and yet many look ahead to 2023 with apprehension. There are indeed many concerns at home and abroad. The concerns that dominate for each of us will vary according to our own circumstances and needs. Over the Christmas and New Year holiday period I had several conversations on the fallout from the pandemic with many people feeling that the negative effects, particularly in relation to mental health and well-being, are still taking their toll. The nervousness at the news that China would reopen its borders is an example of the fear that lingers, not only in relation to physical health, but also over the dread that life could be restricted once again. However we must remember that we are in a very different place to where we were at the start of the pandemic with knowledge, vaccines and medicines available to help prevent such devastating measures being taken again.

For those concerned at the continued cost of living issues I was pleased to see the Government announcement of further support this year for pensioners and those on low incomes. It is also good to see the continued support in relation to energy costs for business and non-domestic customers. This is subject to on-going review in a fast-changing situation.

I know that many constituents are concerned over issues relating to Thames Water. I have written previously on my concerns on storm discharges. I have also raised a number of other specific concerns with the company over time. I was saddened, although not entirely surprised, to read in the Ofwat annual assessment of water company performance that Thames Water fell amongst the worst performers. I am in touch with the Chief Executive of Ofwat on this.

Another concern that also tends to arise with the new year is changes to bus services when timetables are reviewed. Having investigated some of the concerns I understand that for bus companies there are many issues to consider when looking at the sustainability of services. In some cases it is simply a matter of low passenger numbers that makes a route unsustainable, and the companies need to divert resources to other routes where there is greater usage to keep these running. However sometimes the issues are wider. For example on one route up for change the bus company wanted to use double decker buses across the whole route and some of the rural roads included in the journey were not suitable for such vehicles. Whilst the Government does have a National Bus Strategy the challenges in rural areas are many.

There are, of course, many big issues which affect us all which are well rehearsed in the national media and which the government is already working to address. ## **CROWELL CHURCH**

Happy New Year to you all.

What a great Christmas the church had and it stayed warm and welcoming.

A service of carols and readings followed by mulled wine and mince pies, was very well attended on Friday 23rd December. A full church with a great social afterwards. On Sunday 1st January we hosted a United Parish Service, this was also well attended.

The next work party will be February 18th, then March 18th and then the 3rd Saturday of each month at 10am. Depending on the weather we may well concentrate on the inside of the church. There is a great need to remove many cobwebs, clean up the Vestry and generally give some TLC to all the nooks and crannies.

Despite the weather, the car park and graveyard are looking good and standing up well. Although the hedge at the car park entrance has been cut back we still need to cut it back further to get a proper view of oncoming traffic – for safety.

A couple of the hawthorn trees on the B4009 edge of the car park appear to have died. These will need cutting down to prevent them falling. We have managed to grow some cuttings, so we may be able to replace the dead ones.

The Quinquennial Inspection is due and we are awaiting a date from the architect. An architect has been appointed to oversee the damaged window repair and he will also be investigating the viability and cost of connecting mains water and sewerage with a view to building an extension to the North wall adjoining the Vestry for a kitchenette and toilet. Grants are available for some of this cost.

Soul Space has been rescheduled to the 3rd Sunday of each month and so the next Soul Space will be 19th February then 19th March, both at 4pm.

This has allowed St Andrew's to restart a Taizé Service at 6pm on the 1st Sunday of each month. The 1st service will be Sunday 5th February.

Details of all services can be found in the Parish Magazine and on the Parish website.

The United Parish Annual Parochial Church Council meeting will take place on 22nd March. Location to be advised. You need to be registered on the church electoral roll to attend this part. The APCM is preceded by a Vestry meeting to confirm and/or vote into place the Church Wardens. You have to be registered on the civil voters register to attend this.

Full details will be posted on the church porch notice board or main door when available.

The church will always be open when the Wardens are working in it or working in the churchyard. Please call if you would like access for private prayer at other times.

## ASTON ROWANT PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

The December Council meeting is where the precept and budget for the coming financial year are discussed and agreed. The Councillors recognised that the cost of living has increased substantially over the past six months and so agreed not to increase the precept (the charge levied by the Council to allow it to operate) this year. Although the Parish Council component of your Council Tax is very small in comparison with the other elements, the Councillors felt it was important to recognise the challenges some will be facing and not increase the precept.

In my previous piece for the Parish Notes, I highlighted the challenges being faced by the Chinnor Village Centre. As I mentioned in that article, the Council has agreed to increase its contribution to the Village Centre to £1000 in recognition of the support it provides for members of our community. In addition, we have increased the amount given in grants to Aston Rowant Church and the Thames Valley Air Ambulance. We have managed to increase the support we give others without increasing the overall precept by reducing the budget in areas where there has been a consistent underspend and by transferring amounts previously allocated for capital spend to recurrent items.

Since the last edition of the Parish Notes, two new speed indicator devices (SIDs) have been installed on the B4009 in Aston Rowant and Kingston Blount. I am pleased to say that we have received many positive comments from parishioners about both the installation and the impact they appear to be having on traffic passing through the Parish. We are able to collect data from the two devices; these indicate that the vast majority of traffic passing the two SIDs is travelling within the 30mph speed limit. We are considering purchasing an additional SID which can be moved between locations within the Parish to provide an additional deterrent and further speed monitoring. The two SIDs and the vehicle activated sign on the B4009 heading towards the M40 in Aston Rowant are all solar powered. During winter periods of few sunlight hours combined with heavy cloud cover, the demand for activation can outlive the on-board battery supply of power. The consequence of this is that there are occasions when the device does not display anything and so appears not to be working. This is normal operation – the devices will reset themselves automatically once the required battery charge levels are restored.

The combination of wet weather followed by freezing conditions often causes road surfaces to fail and potholes to be formed. I am pleased that a good number of parishioners are using the FixMyStreet app to report the existence of potholes within our Parish. Once reported, Oxfordshire County Council (OCC) investigate the report and usually repair a short time afterwards. Whilst most potholes are an inconvenience, there are some which are large enough to cause damage to vehicles that strike them. OCC will mark these as a priority once investigated but the volume of reports means that there is often a delay in the initial investigation taking place. If a pothole has caused damage to a vehicle it should be reported to the Police by calling the 101 phoneline. This expedites the repair.

The cold spells either side of Christmas caused icy patches on many of the roads within the Parish. Whilst the B4009 is gritted on most occasions when there is a risk of ice, the same cannot be said of the other roads in the Parish. The Council has sought to provide salt bins at points where the roads are known to be icy but the recent freezing weather has highlighted a number of additional places which are not currently near a salt bin. We have reviewed the coverage of salt bins and have agreed to purchase a further five bins to improve road safety in the parish.

Finally, this May sees elections for the Parish Council. There was not an election for the current Council; the number of nominees matched the places available and so an election was not required. However, whilst this is convenient, it is disappointing that only seven people out of an electorate of over 1000 were prepared to put themselves forward. I would encourage individuals to consider putting themselves forward to stand for the Parish Council. Councillors have the opportunity to influence the spend within the community, to represent the Parish on wider groups and to represent your community. If you would like to know more about what being a Councillor involves, please contact the Clerk in the first instance.

- Decide how local money is spent to improve your community
- Bring about improvements through local projects
- Work in partnership with other parishes and agencies

Councillors will work closely with the Clerk, who is an employee of the Council as a whole, in delivering the agreed vision.

#### How much time does it take?

We meet formally eleven times a year on the second Wednesday of the month (except August) at 7:30pm for about two hours. You may also need to give time between meetings for 'ad hoc' tasks e.g. responding to emails, additional occasional meetings for committees or working groups etc.

While the role is voluntary/unpaid, you are an elected member of the Council and will be offered training and guidance on the role.

## Are you eligible?

To be a councillor you must be;

- UK, Commonwealth or EU citizen
- at least 18 years old
- an elector of the parish (or in the past 12 months occupied land) or
- other premises in the parish or
- work in the parish or
- living within 3 miles of the parish boundary

## **NEWS FROM FIVEWAYS**

At the time of writing (8th January) the Holbrook at Fiveways is finally flowing, at least well enough for ducks! However the Woodway Winterbourne running down Church Lane has not run all year. It will not run until its reservoir in the Chilterns is full. All of the Chiltern springs are triggered by a higher or lower water level under the

Chilterns. If the Winterbourne is running at the start of Winter there is a risk of flooding when the winter rains come. I know because dedicated folk in Watlington study these springs all year!

This is the time of year when I look for spawning trout in Lewknor where I fish. Sometimes the brown trout can be seen spawning under the bridge in Nethercote Lane. I was not pleased to see an otter chasing the trout this year near Nethercote Lane. The trout native to this stream are much more endangered than the otters. I have not seen a trout at Fiveways for some years and I am awaiting a sighting of sticklebacks who should be building underwater nests around now. They are the only UK fish to build nests with the full involvement of the male, who changes to full spawning colours. They are normally first seen in the dog pool near the signpost.

I am also hoping that a birdwatcher can tell me if we have lesser or greater spotted Woodpeckers in the dead tree at Fiveways.

The wasps finally disappeared and the Forest School had a great time in the stream wading and using the magnet – some slept in hammocks and all enjoyed it apparently. As usual a few got wet but they just got on with it. A new activity was net fishing for shrimps which they were happy to have crawling on their hands.

I saw the first flower of the year, a very early primrose the other day. The snow drops are emerging and may be nearing their final flowering at duck racing which is on Sunday 19th February. The ducks are keen to go after three years cooped up in my garage. The church will be open as usual for a warming cuppa and a piece of cake. The daffodils are also up under the leaf litter and may even be showing colour by then. Everything seems to get earlier and earlier. The Fritillarias should be interesting providing the mice have not eaten them all, despite the chilli powder protection. There is an unknown tree near to the bench with red tape on it which I couldn't identify even when it had leaves. We will have to wait and see.

In my greenhouse I have chicory seedlings grown from seed collected near Watlington. Chicory has many variants and this is a shrubby variant different from the non-shrubby chicory found at the top of Church Lane. The pale blue flowers look identical - look out for them late summer.

## **OIL SYNDICATE**

There's an oil syndicate that serves the parish and surrounding area with the sole aim of saving members money on heating oil.

The syndicate covers Aston Rowant, Chinnor Hill, Christmas Common, Crowell, Kingston Blount, Lewknor, Milton Common, Postcombe and Tetsworth – and further if there's a need.

It costs nothing to join or be a member of, carries no obligation to buy, and there are no fees or commission added to the price.

The process runs in November, January/February (depending on the weather) and June.

All that is needed to join is a full postal address, email address and phone number. Householders are asked for the maximum volume of oil required. The overall total is collated and suppliers negotiated with. Householders pay the oil company directly and only for the oil that is delivered.

To illustrate the savings, for the top up that ran in January, the syndicate rate was 77p/ litre plus VAT from Lovells. However, just buying 500 litres would have cost between 84.20p/litre plus VAT from Sweetfuels and 85p/litre plus VAT from Lovells.

## SALT BINS

There are numerous salt bins that the parish council has provided, with five more on the way.

Each has, or should have, a shovel and gloves and is refilled once a year free of charge by Oxfordshire County Council and when necessary, by the parish council.

It would help the parish council if residents could take it upon themselves to spread grit on roads and junctions near them when needed; the council is not in a position to lobby residents to undertake this duty.

Please note that the grit salt provided is for public roads and pavements only; it must not be used on private drives and paths.
