# LETTER FROM JOHN HOWELL MP

This month with the local elections we have seen people come and people go as councillors. Firstly my thanks to all those who have worked as local councillors, at parish and district in the last four years or more. Having been a councillor myself I know very well the work that is involved and that sometimes it can be a thankless task. You can never please everyone and there are always more people ready to complain than to compliment. Welcome too to new councillors. I look forward to working with you in the future.

Turnout figures for local elections are generally low. Issues are often raised with me that I have to defer to local councils as the councils are fully autonomous and responsible for their own decisions. So perhaps it is timely to remind people what the different councils do and how elected representatives can help on the relevant issues.

Let me start with the most local level of democracy, the parish council. This the elected body closest to the community. Probably the most common topics that parish councils get involved with are planning matters and working for better services and facilities for the community. As a formal body parish councils have the ability to influence other organisations that make decisions affecting the community such as the district and county councils, health authorities, police. As such parish councils have an important role in local democracy and can be a great resource to support a thriving community. Some smaller communities do not have a parish council but instead have a parish meeting. These have fewer powers and are not required to meet as frequently as a parish council. However they are still formal bodies with a representative role for the community and can often help with relevant issues in the same way that a parish council can.

The next tier of local government in this area is the district council. The constituency is served by two district councils, Cherwell District Council and South Oxfordshire District Council. They are responsible for local services, including planning, housing and associated benefits, rubbish collection. environmental services, leisure services, some car parks and council tax collection.

Finally we have the County Council. This is a much larger council responsible for services across the whole of a county including education, social services, transport, roads (except trunk roads and motorways), public rights of way, libraries, the fire service, culture, trading standards, bus subsidies, minerals, waste and recycling (disposal) and the environment.

Each of these councils has elected representatives who take decisions on the relevant issues and are there to help residents in the areas of their responsibility. These people should be the first port of call to raise concerns with as they have direct access to information and, in the case of the larger councils, the officers employed to assist. From my own experience as a local councillor, and working alongside many other councillors, I know that most people who put themselves forward for these roles do it because they want to help and support their community. I would therefore encourage residents to take an interest in what they do and seek their support if necessary. Just as I can sometimes help with issues relating to central government departments, so local councillors can help with issues relating to their councils' areas of responsibility.

# **CROWELL CHURCH**

April and May saw services remain well attended, along with Soul Space.

Details of all services can be found in the Parish Magazine and on the Parish website.

The Parish APCM took place on 22 March where Andy and Maggs, the two Crowell Wardens were reconfirmed into position. The formal 'Visitation' (swearing in) with the Bishop will take place at Dorchester Abbey on the 8 June for all Wardens in the United Parish and the other churches in the Deanery of Aston and Cuddesden.

The graveyard and carpark have complied with 'no mow May', although footpaths through the grass to tended grave areas have been maintained and thanks to those families attending their loved ones' graves. The carpark garden is being worked on and by the next report it should be completely weed free. The carpark will also have been mowed.

We are aware that the drive out view from the car park has become very restricted due to the rapid growth of hedges and ground cover, so we will be addressing that soonest.

Once 'no mow May' is over we will start to mow but still retain wildlife areas. Hopefully the ride on mower will be available again for the large areas. If not, anyone who has one and is happy to give a little time, would be most appreciated as manually mowing the east end by the pub is very time consuming. We already have evidence of specific plants in the recent wildlife areas which would indicate healthy wild areas.

Work parties were carried out in April and May. Sadly only two people turned up on each occasion but much work was done in the time. Next work parties will be 17 June and 15 July, each at 10am.

We will replace the notices regarding no plastic waste on the compost heap and the correct use of the black and brown bins. These continue to be problem areas with thoughtless disposal.

The Quinquennial Inspection will take place on 15 June, so we should have an idea, after that, what work if any needs doing to the structure and fabric in the next 5 years. The architect will also start the process of getting the damaged west window repaired under insurance and an outline plan for toilet and kitchenette facilities to cost for feasibility.

The church will always be open when the Wardens are working in it or working in the churchyard. Please call if you would like access for private prayer at other times.

# **OBITUARIES**

It is with sadness we record the deaths of four of the Parish's longer term residents.

**Nigel Bennett** was born in Kingston Blount in 1933. He served in the RAF after the war and then returned to work in the family firm with his father and two brothers. He married Pauline and in the mid 80s moved to Icknield Place in Aston Rowant, where he developed his love for racing pigeons. More recently both suffered from bad illnesses, Pauline died a few years ago and Nigel in January this year.

**Colin Wainwright** married Elspeth in 1988 and moved into Aston Park with her children Lara and Gavin, whom he always loved and supported as his own. While pursuing a demanding career, he involved himself in many community activities, notably as a churchwarden for St. Peter and St. Paul's church here for 16 years. He was a fine singer and led the church choir when assembled. In retirement he played a strong supporting role in the development of Elspeth's Quince Products business. Colin died in March.

**Allen Smith** was born in 1930 and after a first career in the aircraft building industry he went on to teach engineering at colleges in Buxton and then High Wycombe. With his wife Shirley and two sons they moved to Pleck Lane in KB in 1989, after which time Allen has busied himself as a contributor to every form of community life and action – Parish Council, Church PCC, the old village hall, the Fete and anything else that was going on. Allen suffered from bad health for many years, something which he bore stoically till his death in early March.

Ann Speechley left home at 15 to pursue her passion for horseriding and it was as an instructor that she met and married Roger in 1964. Together they built a highly successful business, but found time to have a daughter, Sarah, and in the late 60s they were among the first to move into the then newly developing Aston Park. Ann had a strong Christian faith and did much to support the local church and community. She also had a difficult time through poor health for some years and she died on 24th April in Stoke Mandeville.

# **ASTON ROWANT PARISH COUNCIL NEWS**

A new Parish Council was formed on 17th of May. I am pleased to say that we have three new councillors and four carried over from the previous council. We have a good representation of the villages, with four councillors from Aston Rowant and three from Kingston Blount. This council is a mixture of young parents and some of us with more experience, and for the first time we have more women than men on the council. You can find a full list of councillors and contact details on page 6.

I would like to thank our previous Chair, Peter Tinson, for his hard work during seven years in the seat. Well done Peter – we are all very grateful for everything you have done for the community.

In taking on the role of chair I was interested to understand a bit more of the history of Parish Councils and was surprised to find that Parish Councils have only been in existence for 129 years. Before 1894, when the Local Government Act was passed and Parish Councils were created local governance was by lord-lieutenants appointed by the Crown with administration run by the church. Prior to this, regional areas such as ours were controlled by Norman Lords and before them, Saxon Lords appointed by the King dating back to 700AD. Self-governance is still comparatively young compared to 1,200 years of Lords being in control!

I grew up in Kingston Blount, and when I started on the Parish Council ten years ago, we had recently moved back to the village with small children. With the school and Montessori, and many fêtes and street fairs, it's been a wonderful place for them to grow up, and it's great to see so many young families helping to make this a thriving parish community. I'm honoured to take on the responsibility of Chair. With a role like this, there is always a lot of admin involved, but it is both interesting and fulfilling to play an active role in making improvements to our Parish so that it continues to be a great place to live and enjoy.

Many of the projects the Parish Council are currently working on are well underway and carried over from the last council. We are looking at installing new playground equipment and sports facilities for the playing field. There are, of course, many more mundane jobs and tasks that need to be done to keep our villages well maintained, but I'm excited to be looking at creating more footpaths and improving the ones we have, as well as undertaking more conservation projects. # **ASTON ROWANT PARISH COUNCIL NOTES**

Parish Council meetings were held on Wednesday 12th of April 2022 and Wednesday 17th of May where the planning applications detailed below were discussed. (The next meeting of the Council will be held on Wednesday 14th of June 2023).

## **PLANNING APPLICATIONS:**

**P23/S0875/DIS** Discharge of condition 4: (Submission of details) parts a), b) and c) on planning application P22/S0907/LB at Chalford Manor Farm, Chalford. For information only.

# ARPC FOOTPATH AND AMENITIES GROUP

Please see Mike Eaton's notes on Fiveways (p22) for the news from the Nature Reserve.

Well spring has well and truly sprung. The combination of the wet weather and the (slowly) increasing temperatures has led to a massive growth spread of all plants. You may be aware that Councils across Oxfordshire will be supporting No Mow May by allowing grass verges to grow long in May and beyond – in order to prioritise and promote biodiversity across the county. Unfortunately, this combined with what was effectively a no mow April as the expected cut from Oxfordshire County Council did not happen has meant the verges and footpaths have grown to the point that they are out of control. My thanks to Adam Bernstein, Matt Day, Peter Hulse and Jim Donald who have volunteered their time to cut back both the verges and footpaths. By the time you read this the footpaths will have been cut back and hopefully we will have a new contractor on board.

The permissive path to Crowell has also been damaged by the recent water problems. Thames Water are responsible for the damage and will repair the path and remove the barriers but at the time of writing this has not happened.

In the last edition of the Notes, I referred to the updated Walks at the Foot of the Chilterns booklet which has been rewritten and updated by Peter Hetherington. All new parishioners are historically given a copy from the Parish Council. If you are new to the parish please contact Tracy Lambourne the parish clerk. Additionally, copies are on sale at the Lockdown Larder, the Leathern Bottle and Chinnor Village Centre – at £3 it is very good value.

The removal work in the 'lanes' in Kingston Blount has now been finished with the removal of the tree stumps behind the Old Shepherd of Mutton. We will look to replant native plants in the autumn.

It is sad to report that on March 31st a sewer pipe burst in Aston Rowant and sewage ran down Church Lane, Aston Rowant Road and on into Fiveways. This was caused in part by wet wipes blocking the pipes. Please remember not to flush these and risk the chance of a blockage.

The meeting due for May 16th had to be rescheduled, but we still have a vacancy on the Group and if that person could help with Pleck Wood in Kingston Blount they would be doubly welcomed.

The first was held on Friday 14th April and was to raise money for two local hospices. In addition to hot drinks and cakes we had books, plants and a raffle, and in addition there was a used sale for childrens' items which raised almost £40 towards the playground refurbishment. We had a good turnout of both young and old parishioners and we are pleased to announce that £125 was given to both Rennie Grove and Sue Ryder hospices.

Since then we have been open weekly for a chat/coffee/cakes and a book swap. There is a bookcase in the entrance hall if you wish to donate books or to take a few to read.

Following discussions with people on Fridays we have decided that in future they will be held either biweekly or monthly and we will try to have different themes which will be advertised separately. The playground refurbishment committee are going to be involved monthly on the last Friday of the month and hold a regular sale of children's items and will provide toys for children to come along and play together during the morning.

# NEWS FROM THE VILLAGE HALL, HILLWERKE RECREATIONAL TRUST (HRT)

The Village Hall will be closed during the months of July and August to replace the damp proof course which has failed and to lay a new floor. We apologise in advance to those who live close to the Hall whilst the floor is being dug out. The first part of the work is scheduled to start on the 10th July and will finish on the 24th July we then need to allow the screed to dry so that the new floor can be laid. We expect to be up and running again by the end of August.

The Committee is aware that the goal posts have not yet been replaced. This is something that we will be addressing once the floor has been completed. We are keeping a financial contingency back due to the fact that the replacement of the hall floor is not covered by our insurance and HRT are having to fund the work. Grants are being applied for to help in the payment of the floor and we will be applying to SODC for help towards the purchase of the goal posts.

Whilst the playground is not the responsibility of HRT we have paid for the play equipment outside of the park and for the fitness area. Over the last couple of years we have also approved two donations of  $\pounds 2,000$  one to help fund maintenance work on the playground and the other to help repair the fence. We acknowledge that we have many bookings from people for family/children's parties because of the playground and as such we will continue to support the fund raising activities by allowing use of the Hall for no charge.

As part of our aim to bring the community together we have started a Friday coffee morning. Please see article elsewhere in the notes for further information.

Keep an eye out on the troughs over the next few weeks as these are currently being replanted with herbs. There is already sage and rosemary in two of them, oregano, thyme, parsley and mint will be planted in the others. So if you need some herbs pop down and take a piece.



# **NEWS FROM FIVEWAYS**

As I write this the early spring flowers are gone - however I have been encouraged by the spread of many of our wild flower introductions. In particular the wild daffodils have dropped seed and after nearly ten years there are very many young seedlings. This contrasts with cultivated daffodils. The same is true of the cowslips, greater stitchwort, toadflax and wood anemones. It does take decades for many of them to establish themselves. It is possible in the decades to come that Fiveways will seed the surrounding areas with wild daffodils.

A few fish have been seen – probably Sticklebacks and Bullheads. To be sure I will try and catch a Bullhead – I think I saw one, but you need a net (and camera) to be sure. They are very rarely seen, hiding away during the day and only coming out at night to feed. The Sticklebacks had a hard time here last year as many were seen dead from the heat. Locally trout were also killed, this happens once the water temperature gets above 20 degrees. Trout fishing is banned then as the fish cannot take the extra stress of being caught. I have seen otters in the local area too.

The deer have taken a liking to the Holm Oak now that protection has been removed but to date it is fairly superficial.

I am pleased to see the public have become more aware of our streams but I remain unconvinced that politicians, including local ones, take the subject seriously. The problem is deep rooted with poor documentation on existing drains and even poorer records of the discharges. Many drains are very old and have erroneously set discharge limits into streams that are toxic levels for water-life. However more houses keep being built without any evidence the drainage system can cope. We should all do our bit in ensuring our ditches and streams are as nature intended.

There was a sewage leakage recently in Aston Rowant – the sewer involved runs from the Lambert Arms down Chinnor Road and into Aston Road and down Church Lane before going across the fields. The blockage was caused by wet wipes - they are still in use and cause most blockages!! The sewage ran as far as Fiveways before it was sorted. This was not the fault of the water company. Shortly afterwards we had a water-main burst in Church Lane with significant flooding as far as Fiveways - some thought it may help to wash the sewage away!

I would be interested to hear from anyone keen to collect wild flower seed or anyone with useful tree seedlings as we are always keen to continue planting the area.



We have spread out a bit from Fiveways and replaced some trees which were planted by the parish council and have died – perhaps due to drought (see picture). The trees originally planted were quite large and couldn't cope so we have replaced them with much smaller ones. Two oaks are between KB recreation ground and the Icknield Way. I hope to keep better records so we know where they are and it would be useful to have a person responsible for keeping these records.

The Forest School visited Fiveways again on May 9. It is always nice to join them for their visit and again we were impressed by the resilience of the children and their interest in nature. As usual we found loads of 'treasure' in the stream and we are always amazed by the amount of metal that comes out of the stream with the magnet.

Pleck Wood has a mixture of Spanish and English bluebells - like Fiveways. Please do not plant Spanish bluebells in the wild as they will eventually eliminate the English natives. I spend time removing them from my garden and it is not easy. I also have a thing about Pacific Coast Irises but they are much easier to get out. Virtually all the bluebells in the parish are Spanish except those at the top of the Chilterns.


