Lived at Christmas Cottage used to be Peruba, 9 years there, then moved to Hill Crest, the house by Parkers, this area was all orchards where her bungalow is now.

Dick bought Oakley House, he has been 12 years at Aston, it was empty for 1 year, lived there from 1954. Edwards was last baker there before that, still had old bakehouse at the back.

Yard opposite Christmas Cottage, bought it all for a yard for the lorries.

Granny Hill, Henry's widow lived in the Firs. Grandfather Henry moved from Crowell and lived in Hill House in KB. The Red House is Cheryl's. Hill house is Donaldson's.
