CHAIRMAN'S NOTE

Fiveways

Walkers passing Fiveways in Aston Rowant will have noticed that it has a new bridge. The old one had degraded and was potentially dangerous. The parish council sought quotes for a replacement and the most competitive and best designed option was chosen – from Matthew Day. The new bridge was built just in time for the Duck Race, which by all accounts, was one of the most successful ever held.

In overview, the new bridge should last as its footings are approximately two foot deep and have a hardcore base and cast concrete up stands. The steel supports are made of galvanised metal and have been set into the concrete. The platform has been made from solid oak and stainless steel screws. The main oak beams have been deliberately left unfixed to the steel supports to allow them to move as the oak dries; this should prevent damage to the footings and oak. The bridge, it is hoped, should outlast all of us and go on for 100 years.

Planning

In recent months, the parish council has leafleted residents in relation to two planning applications that were felt to be injurious to the parish.

The first was for an application in principle for a house in Church Lane in Aston Rowant that would have expanded the village footprint somewhat. As this was a matter for the whole parish – we are all surrounded by fields - everyone was leafleted. We were successful with SODC, and the application was refused.

However, **the application has been sent to the Planning Inspectorate.** This means that **the parish council needs residents to write again with comments objecting.** The weblink for this is <https://acp.planninginspectorate.gov.uk> and the application can be found using reference number 3361560.

More recently, an application to put an extension on 10 The Green – part of the large four-property white building on the green in Aston Rowant – and to turn half of the garden into a driveway was received. While many, including the parish council, wholehearted agree that the property (not whole structure) is in dire need of renovation as it's in a dreadful state and uninhabitable, the application made was felt to not be in keeping with the locale and was decidedly unsympathetic in design and the use of materials. To save on cost the council only leafleted Aston Rowant as the application was in all likelihood of immediate concern to residents in that part of the parish. We are awaiting SODC's decision.

It needs to be noted that in neither instance is the council seeking to set a precedent where ARPC objects to every application and so subsequently leaflets to encourage support for its view. Rather, by chance, these two applications were for applications in sensitive areas that if approved could harm the parish.

Overall, it's fair to say that the parish council will object to applications that it considers detrimental but will seek to support those that are felt to be right for the location and which have been designed sympathetically – taking local opinion into account where relevant.

Spring parish litter pick

The spring parish litter pick is being held on Saturday 10 May (meeting 1000hrs in the Cherry Tree car park) and Sunday 11 May (meeting 1000hrs in the lay-by on the A40 opposite the Lambert Arms). As before, the plan is to collect whatever has been discarded – and there is much – from within the parish boundary. Filled sacks will be collected by SODC shortly after the event. As the saying goes, many hands make light work and so it would be both helpful and good to have as many as possible in on the pick; with a good number the picks could be over in an hour or so.

Picking sticks and bags will be provided – helpers just need to wear suitable clothing and bring gloves. All need to be over 16 years of age. For more information, contact Steven Sowerby on stevensowerby@hotmail.com.

Offroad driving

Lastly, the parish council has become aware of individuals riding motorbikes on the grass by the village hall and also through Pleck Wood. Vehicles are not permitted on the grass without permission and absolutely not in the woods. The incident has been reported to the police.

If residents witness this type of behaviour, the council would appreciate the matter being reported to the police via 101. Evidence is important, but this must only be gathered if it involves no risk. If the riders or drivers are known, please inform both the parish council, as well as the police of their identity and address.

FIVEWAYS

The Duck Racing has come and gone and was a great success – many thanks to all the participants, netters and supporters. The ducks are retired for another year and back in my garage. If anyone wants to buy a few more ducks they come from JustDucks – and are Race Ducks (self righting) and they can be personalised. The weather was relatively kind to us and there was no shortage of water. The Church did well and it was a good forum for involving new parishioners. I did turn up at the end for a chat and cakes.

The wild flowers are out at Fiveways and the daffodils look very strong. By the large Black Poplar (one of the rarest trees in the UK), is a fantastic clump of self-sown daffodils. It is a 7 year cycle but they are now rampant.

A good advert for the native plants who are such good seeders. If you are thinking of planting daffodils around the village please plant wild ones as they spread. We have both the native colours the bicolour yellow/cream and the yellow – I prefer the single colour which is more expensive (available from Naturescape – in Notts). Ideally, we should transplant some around the site now, if we can find the labour.

The snowdrops were good but probably need more light. Again, it is a question of volunteers to thin out the hedge on the south side again. The environment agency suggested this some years back when they visited but it has re-grown.

The walkway/footbridge has been replaced by the PC, and the ends only need tidying up. Matt Day and his team, who did the work, think we will get 100 years from the oak timber if kept away from the moist soil.

We have a team of elusive young ‘water engineers’ on site in recent years. I put things in the stream and they move them around. If they get in touch, I think I can use their skills! The bullheads (fish) are bonded to particular stones and will relocate if the stone is moved – I am not joking. They hide under them – away from predators. The pottery rounds and half rounds in the stream are fish sanctuaries when the stream is high. A Lesser Egret has recently been reported fishing in the dog pool.

At the time of writing, I have seen the first Wood Anemones at the top end. They spread from rhizomes and were planted in memory of my mother-in-law in 2015. They are encroached on by ivy which is hard to restrict!

It is worth keeping an eye out for the white wild garlic which borders the stream. It can be confused with the deadly Lilly of the Valley, but there is none on site.

Keen fish watchers are competing for the first sighting which is likely to be in the dog pool (by the kissing gate) again. Hopefully as with all sightings it will be reported on Share your records/Thames Valley Environmental Records Centre. I will try again to get a photo this year, but they are lightning fast when they see a net.

I will stop there but keep an eye out for the Fritillarias, which have foliage similar to grass but dramatically better flowers.

Work Parties recommenced on 8 March at 10:00hrs. They will continue on the 2nd Saturday of each month up to and including November – with the exception of July and August.

NEWS FROM ARCC

The 2025 cricket season is almost here! The first game at Butts Way will be on Easter Saturday April 19th when our first team will play Horspath. The league season does not start until May 10th but there are plenty of activities before then. We will, as usual, run 4 senior teams on Saturdays as well as many junior teams. Additionally All Stars on Friday evenings.

The highlight for many will be the start of junior training on Friday 25th April when the bar will be fully open and people will be able to sign up for membership. The bar will be open on Friday nights and whenever Senior Cricket is played on the top pitch.

With the new season comes the membership renewal, both playing and social. The details are on our website astonrowantcricket.co.uk with prices held at the same level as last year.

We are particularly keen that 1881 members should renew their membership before the 25th April. The reason for this is that all the monies raised by the 1881 club are used to fund projects at the club. All the monies raised this year will be used to finish the pavilion on the bottom ground.

If you are not already an 1881 club member for a cost of £60 you will receive a 20% discount on bar purchases and also receive a copy of our many newsletters through the summer updating you on all club activities.

The bottom ground pavilion is up and functional but we have tasks to complete. Whilst these will be finished and paid for before the season starts it will deplete our reserves which we are going to have to rebuild before the next phase of the long-term plan is started.

The main issue we have has been VAT. We were advised that all our expenditure would be exempt from VAT. Unfortunately, that advice has proved incorrect and we have incurred £25K which was not planned.

To be clear the club is still financially strong and will remain so, but at present the next phase will take longer than we would wish.

So this year there will be serious concentration on fund raising. As well as the 1881 club, we are running the 200 club, see Heather's article (p17). Rowachella is fixed for the 14th June and tickets are already selling well.

There will be other events in the summer and the first of these is our annual curtain raiser. This year it will be at the Lambert Arms on the evening of April 26th starting at 7pm. The tickets are £20 which includes a curry and music. For more information contact our Club Captain Ben Knowler on 07890 49134 .

2025 promises to be a great year for the club. We have entered the Village Knockout Cup and qualified for what is in effect the Town Knockout Cup. We look forward to seeing many of you at the club. All are welcome – please come and see some great cricket and a great social gathering.

Allotment Fun Facts

- Allotments are often measured in poles (or rods), a traditional unit of measurement that equals 16.5 feet. This system comes from the old practice of using a “surveyor’s rod” to measure land. Interestingly, 1 acre is the same as 160 poles, and this measurement is still used today in land surveys.
- Allotments are not just for everyday people – even famous figures have been known to enjoy them! For instance, Albert Einstein had an allotment in Berlin in 1922 when he was living there. At the time, he was reprimanded for neglecting his plot, with weeds taking over due to his busy schedule. In more recent years, former Labour Party leader Jeremy Corbyn is known for having his own allotment, where he grows fruit and even makes jam from his harvest.
- Many famous figures have found solace and joy in gardening, with several having their own vegetable patches. For example, Kate Moss is known to enjoy gardening and reportedly has a vegetable patch where she grows her own produce. David Beckham also has a vegetable garden at his home, where he tends to his crops. These famous faces, among others, show that allotments and vegetable patches aren’t just for the everyday gardener – they are enjoyed by some of the world’s most well-known individuals.
- A fun fact: The Good Life, the popular 1970s BBC sitcom, has had a huge comeback 46 years after it last aired, but with a twist! The show, which originally

followed a couple trying to live self-sufficiently, has been revived as a theatre play. This revival highlights the growing interest in the “grow-your-own” lifestyle, showing how self-sufficiency and sustainability are still important today.

- In Birmingham, a comprehensive study on allotments revealed that 88% of plot-holders grow potatoes, making them the most commonly cultivated crop. Additionally, over three-quarters of plot-holders cultivate onions and shallots, brassicas, tomatoes, and courgettes.
- If added together, all the UKs allotments would equal 58 Hyde Parks.

We do have a number of vacant plots. Plots vary in size and you do not need a degree in horticulture to be successful.

LETTER FROM THE HEADTEACHER

LOCAL STREAMS AT THE FOOT OF THE CHILTERNNS.

As well as my usual Fiveways article, I am writing this note to cover wider environmental issues around our local streams. These are designated as chalk streams by Natural England and shown on page 31. Yes, I know there are errors on the upper River Thames catchment streams – they need remapping as some streams disappear from time to time.

Chalk streams, as many will know, are a very rare habitat globally. They are known to spring from chalk hills, such as the Chilterns, and to contain trout and fish which depend on clean water and access to spawning beds.

The Thames catchment is monitored by the River Thames Conservation Trust (RTCT), a charity based in Wheatley. They organise excellent environment meetings and are responsible for providing advice and, amongst other things, building fish passes. A priority for them is to engage with local stakeholders with the aim of improving the Thames and tributaries and promoting best practice. A longer term aim might be better protection of the watercourses and National Park status for the Chilterns!

The map features our local headwaters of the River Thames. Sheep Brook in Lewknor, which rises by the church, has native brown trout, and anglers fish for them and stocked rainbow trout in the private lake. The brown trout are highly protected by anglers. Despite the shallowness of the stream, the brown trout spawn in Lewknor and can reach 5-6lb, which is scarcely credible. They are beautifully marked and have been there since the last ice age. They are endangered by otters and run-off from the M40 which likely contains, amongst other chemicals, arsenic from brake pads. Lewknor's sewage treatment works also discharges near Nethercote Lane. Fish movement in the stream(s) should not be hindered, as access to spawning beds is required. There is a source pond behind the church which runs into Nethercote Brook which few locals recognise.

Aston Rowant and Crowell parishes have in total “4” streams - some shared. The Holbrook (at Fiveways) is joined by a significant stream coming from the Stadway on its way to Thames. It has had trout in my recent memory, but it contains at present Sticklebacks and Bullheads. There are no water voles – proved absent by environmental DNA (RTCT). The habitat is however ideal for them.

The remaining three streams A,B,C are un-named which does little to protect them. If anyone knows their historical names please let me know. The Kingston stream A goes through a ford on the Icknield Way.

The significant Crowell stream, B, starts near Oakley, where there is an important and unexplored source pond, which is sadly threatened by the building work near Chinnor. This is an important stream, which could support trout, and heads towards Sydenham/Kingston Stert (which has a record high water table in Oxfordshire) – and also has otters. The source pond near Oakley is another example of an unrecognised and important source of diversity – a sanctuary for >>

water life, which should be afforded maximum protection. It is believed by the author that trout can spawn in this unique environment.

Stream C runs from Aston Rowant school through the Icknield Way ford to join the Holbrook lower down.

I would like to think we are pro-active rather than reactive especially at a Parish Council level. Environmental monitoring is good in Thame but the upper catchment is much less studied at present. I am grateful to Rebecca Smith for registering on Share your records – Thames Valley Environmental Records Centre the only recorded wildlife sighting in our immediate upper catchment area area was a Little Egret in the dog pool at Fiveways. We are well behind the pack and I too am at fault! Please report any special sightings that you see. My take home message is we should be more environmentally aware of the chalk streams (especially in schools) and I hope to return to this topic.
